#### DIRECTOR'S NOTE

I'm a bit hard pressed to say exactly what it was that attracted me to Arborophilia.

The 2016 election was over, and I admit to some despondence. I'd previously decided that I wanted to find a new, or new-ish play to propose for Stroller's 2017/18 season. Something in my gut told me I needed to find a play that would assuage my civil despair. Frankly, I was looking for something more overtly political than *Arborophilia*. But then I ran across a review of a 2006 premiere at the Detroit Repertory Theatre. One of the actors in the original production told the Detroit Free Press:

"Arborophilia is a great comedy. It has more laugh-out-loud funny lines than most of the plays I've done. And it speaks to me--about how we can challenge race, age, gender, class and geographical boundaries and how we should challenge them more."

I was intrigued, and contacted the playwright asking for a copy of the script. Half-way through my first reading, I was hooked. *Arborophilia* reminds me that even in that dark night of the soul that characterizes contemporary American politics, laughing at ourselves is often the best medicine.
