DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Jessica Witham put it best when summarizing this show... "we dared to do a show about ghosts in the face of the theatre gods and... well, they spanked us." In the process of mounting *Blithe Spirit*, three weeks before we opened, we lost our lead actress. Then, a few days later, illness took another actor for a good part of the rehearsal process. We ended up having to block the show three times between filtering in the actors and the understudies. Tensions became high, stress levels were at red alert and fires needed to be put out on a regular basis.

But here's the thing: when you have really, really talented and committed actors and crew that know their jobs and can be agile in the face of adversity, nothing can get in the way of making the production come to life. Tenacity and love of the art become motivation to overcome any obstacle in your path. I'm so very, very proud of what we have brought together and the love of the art that we, as a cast and crew, get the privilege to share with you tonight.

During load-in for this show, one of the actors shared her philosophy about acting with me and I find it very appropriate for this show. She said "The characters in a play only ever get to live when a play is being staged. They have no life on the page and only ever get to live though the actor. I see it as a debt I owe to the character to give them the best life I can give them while I have the honor to embody them and to be their voice." So, as nothing could stop us from getting here, we just want to say, thank you for joining us this evening and letting these characters, these ghosts, live for you.


