DIRECTOR'S NOTE

Hir, by Taylor Mac, is feminist, gender and queer theory released from its academic obscurity and unleashed on stage in the junk-filled, claustrophobic home of a working class American family. Hir (pronounced "here") is the preferred gender pronoun of son Max, the bright light of the future for the family. Hir parents include Arnold, who is "not all there" after a stroke ended years of abusing his children and wife, Paige. She is the former victim in the process of becoming woke. Paige gleefully emasculates Arnold and retires from all tasks associated with the housewife. We join them for an exciting day in their lives – Isaac is returning from the war after three years, a dishonorably discharged, meth-abusing prodigal son. For years, he has been dreaming of home, but nothing is the same.

The path to Strollers' production of *Hir* is a reflection of the diaspora of community theatre before, during and following a pandemic. Sam D. White tried to get a few theatre companies to produce *Hir* back in 2018-19 and StageQ agreed to stage it in the 2020 season. The director was confirmed, the play was cast and just as the rehearsals were getting underway, Covid shut down community theatre for two years. It has been a slow process to attract an audience back to theatres, and rehearsals can result in waves of all the illnesses none of us had while masked for two years. *Hir* was picked up by Strollers in fall of 2022 missing a director and cast member. In the middle of auditions for Isaac, Sam and I reconnected to see if he could help me back into Madison community theatre. In a flash, we were underway.

Hir and post-pandemic community theatre share a paradigm shift – we can move from joy to nightmare and back again, but our traditions and assumptions have been irrevocably altered. We are unsettled and working our way toward the new.


